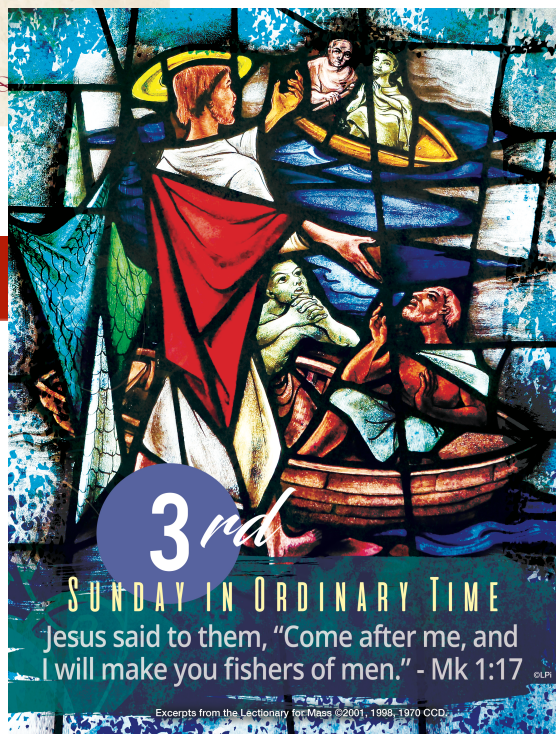
2020 MMG CONTRIBUTION STATEMENTS
