## Being Catholic ...

### Why does the music change during Lent?

Lent is when Catholics prepare for Easter, remembering their baptism and doing penance. The 40 days of lent begin on Ash Wednesday and last until Palm Sunday. As the music minister, I would like to share what you can expect musically and explain why Lent changes it.

There are four main differences in liturgical music:

- Absence of the "Gloria"
- Wording changes for the Gospel acclamation
- Instrumentation becomes softer than normal
- Hymns observe the Lenten theme

The "Gloria" hymn comes from the angels' language about Christ's birth. During Lent, the Church spiritually enters a state of seclusion and thirst for the Messiah. Since Christ's birth does not chronologically or thematically fit this season, we omit the "Gloria." It is also taken out during Advent since this is another time we await Christ.

The gospel acclamation is a sung part of the mass that occurs right before the priest or deacon reads the Gospel. Typically, this is the "Alleluia" with a verse from the lectionary. However, the Church removed the Alleluia from the Mass during Lent to create a more penitential atmosphere. This change occurs to emulate the exile in Old Testament Israel, which excludes us from singing with the choirs of angels. So, alternatively, the parish will sing the phrase "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory" before the Gospel.

The words from Ezekiel 36:26 seem appropriate for Lent: "I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh." Like our hearts are softened, the music should become soft as well. Music is supplementary to the liturgy and should approximately reflect the context of the season. In Lent, singing becomes the central source of any music. It is traditional to decrease instrumentation and simplify the arrangements.

Finally, as always, song selections are inspired by the larger context of the Church, specifically by seasons and readings. For example, Lent is a time of penance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Several themes appear in the Lenten readings each year of the liturgical calendar, including repentance and renewal, preparing for Christ's death, appealing to God's mercy and compassion.
