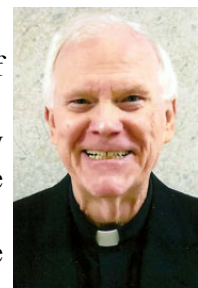

## Being Catholic ...

### Father Jim is leaving, but where does he go now? What do we need to know about the organization of the Church in our diocese?

Father Jim and Deacon Mark have offered a simple explanation on the differences between a senior priest, pastor, associate pastor, and administrator:

**An Administrator** is a priest with full faculties but needs a little more experience to be titled a pastor. As an administrator, he has limited authority for any changes to property/buildings/staff, etc., without permission from the Bishop.

**An Associate Pastor** is usually assigned 1-2 years under a pastor's supervision in a larger parish.

**A Pastor** is usually assigned to a smaller parish or multiple parishes and eventually to larger parishes.

**A Senior Priest** is still very much a priest but no longer has the responsibilities associated with being a Pastor. Senior priests regularly help out as needed in parishes when they are well enough to do so. The parish is no longer responsible for their salary, benefits and expenses. These are now taken care of by the Diocesan Financial Office.

### Management According to the Apostles

If you've ever worked in any kind of organization, for-profit or not-for-profit, I'm sure you have attended a conference or two. Whatever our expectations going in, I usually find these conferences expose me to communication and problem-solving styles that are different from my own, nudging me into a little unexpected self-discovery. And it's a great opportunity to meet new people and do something different.

Here's my idea for a leadership conference: The Management Style of the Apostles. Think about it, the only thing the apostles had more abundantly than holiness was problems. Lots and lots of problems ... most of them of the human resources variety. It's no small feat, starting Christ's Church on earth. I wouldn't want to be project manager of that endeavor.

The Acts of the Apostles is, in some ways, a big book full of problems and ways to solve them. It's a blueprint for tackling interpersonal issues in the manner of a true steward, who encounters every problem starting from the same place: What would my Master want?

It's a question we should be asking ourselves every time we, too, encounter a problem — especially problems relating to other people. What is the truth in this situation, and how would God have me communicate it? How could I handle this in a way that is worthy of the name of my Master?

In Acts, we see a lot of characteristics of everyday stewardship. We see the Apostles mindfully acknowledge the lack of peace that is posed by problems like false teachings, this Gospel's problem du jour. They prayerfully confront the obstacles to salvation posed by these issues. Always, always, always, their main objective is to reveal the will of God, remaining committed to the truth while helping newcomers find avenues to salvation. Maybe I'm just saying it because it's my idea — but it sounds like a conference we could all use.

Our meetings are conducted in person as well as virtually via Go-To-Meeting. Sr. Mary Ann Azar, DC, is our Sister Moderator. If you would like to help but are already involved in so many organizations, membership requirements are very minimal with our organization. Attending meetings are not a requirement of membership. 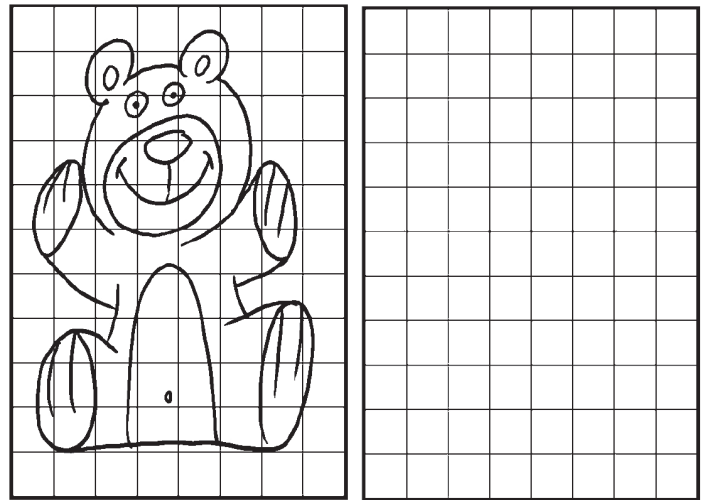
