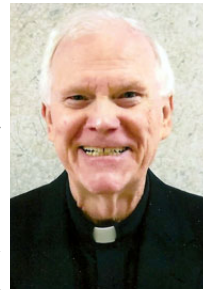
HELP THE YELLVILLE FOOD CLOSET
