
QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

HELP PROTECT BABIES WHOSE PARENTS CAN'T KEEP THEM



The Safe Haven Baby Box is a device where parents can legally give up a newborn who is no more than 30 days old. As long as the baby has not been

abused or neglected, the parent may anonymously use a Safe Haven Baby Box without fear of arrest or prosecution. Currently, a parent can surrender an infant at the hospital emergency room, police departments, and manned fire stations.

There are already six designated baby boxes in Arkansas, and the St. Peter the Fisherman Health Ministry, along with the Knights of Columbus would like to bring a Safe Haven Baby Box to the Twin Lakes Area. A location has been selected and a goal of \$16,000 has been set.

Look for our table in the vestibule after Mass on July 10th. Donations will be accepted at that time. Please make checks payable to Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc. and include "Safe Haven Baby Box" on the memo line.

When discussing relics, we often hear the terms "first-class," "second-class," and "third-class."

What do these terms mean?

Relics of the saints are the most precious heirlooms of the Church. They are not simply historical mementos, but a means through which God has chosen to bestow great graces to those who venerate them.

These "classes" are the categories into which the Church organizes her relics, based on each relic's proximity to the saint in question.

First-class: This is the "highest" form of relic, and refers to a piece of the body of the saint—including bones, hair, etc. This class also includes relics of Christ's Passion, such as pieces of the True Cross.

Second-class: These relics are items that belonged to or were used by the saint, such as clothing, books, and rosaries, or an instrument used in the torture or death of a martyr.

Third-class: These are items—such as a rosary, piece of cloth, or prayer card—that have been touched to a first or second class relic.
