Being Catholic ...

No, this is not true. Catholics honor (or venerate) the Blessed Mother; they do not worship her. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (the official teaching of the Church) teaches that worship (or adoration) is meant for God alone. Catholics as well as the Orthodox and some older Protestant groups venerate Mary and the Saints. Mary is venerated because she is full of God's own life and love, his Grace (Luke 1:28). Mary, by her own free will said yes to God's will and brought the Savior of humanity, Jesus Christ, into the World. Mary is great because God made her great, she reflects the light of Christ and her soul magnifies the Lord (Luke 1:46). This is why since the earliest days of Christianity, Mary has been venerated and loved by Christians. Finally why would a Christian not have love and respect for Mary?

As in the past, we are asking members of the community to support our efforts thru purchase of a blessing bag at Harps in Yellville. Blessing bag donations are now being sold at Harps for \$10. The bags for distribution on Nov 19 with the turkeys will include: 2 cans of corn, 2 cans of green beans, gravy (mix or jar), Brown-n-serve rolls, potato flakes, cranberry sauce/jelly, a can of

potato flakes, cranberry sauce/jelly, a can of sweet potato, vanilla pudding, a can of mixed fruit.

WE NEED MORE EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS WE NEED <u>YOU</u>

The administration of Holy Communion during the Mass is truly a ministry. It is the ministry of bringing the sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ to the People of God. It is also the ministry of witnessing to faith in the real presence of Christ in the action of sharing in the Eucharistic meal of Christ's sacrifice. The ministry of the Eucharist should, therefore, be treated with utmost dignity and reverence.

Baptized and Confirmed Catholics, fifteen years of age or older, are eligible for this ministry. They should be persons who sincerely try to live the Gospel message in their communal and individual lives. They should faithfully participate in the Sunday Eucharist and with God's grace strive to live their faith in every aspect of their lives.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may wear their regular clothing in keeping with their primary role as members of the assembly.


