

Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday after Easter Sunday by Our Lord's own request. Our Lord said to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon souls who approach the font of Mercy.

My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. (p. 48)

The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. (p. 52)

"In order to fittingly observe the Feast of Mercy we should:

- 1. Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter;
- 2. Sincerely repent of all our sins;
- 3. Place our complete trust in Jesus;
- 4. Go to Confession, preferably before that Sunday;
- 5. Receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast;
- 6. Venerate* the Image of Divine Mercy;
- 7. Be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.

 *To venerate a sacred image or statue simply means to perform some act or make some gesture of deep religious respect toward it because of the person whom it represents in this case, our Most Merciful Savior." (p. 54-55)

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy may be said at any time (and is especially beneficial prayed at the bedside of a dying person), but Our Lord specifically told St. Faustina to recite it during the nine days before the Feast of Mercy. It begins then on Good Friday. (p .57) It is greatly recommended that the intentions starting on page 62 of the booklet be added to the Chaplet on the appropriate day.



Announcement to be read at all Masses, weekend of March 25 and 26, 2023 regarding Holy Thursday Collection for Seminarians

Dear friends in Christ,

The Holy Thursday Collection for Seminarians was started in 2009 to give everyone the opportunity to help support the education of our seminarians. Since that time, you have donated over four million dollars (\$4,000,0000), and every dollar has been used for seminarian education and formation. Your generosity has been overwhelming, and I want to thank you for your prayers and support.

There is good news about <u>your</u> Holy Investment in Faith! Over the past 16 years, the Diocese of Little Rock has ordained 45 men to the priesthood. They faithfully serve your needs all across our diocese. I am proud to say, and they would agree, that the fruit of their vocations are a result of your prayers, your sacrifices, and your generosity.

And the good news of <u>your</u> Holy Investment in Faith continues! In 2023, God willing, 2 additional men will be ordained to minister to your needs as priests. We will ordain another young man as a transitional deacon. We currently have 20 seminarians and anticipate <u>5 more</u> young men joining us in the fall. I invite you once again this year to open your hearts and help support these young men who will someday be your priests.

Your donation directly supports the education of these future priests of our diocese. The education cost for each of these 20 diocesan seminarians is **thirty six thousand dollars per year**, which is equivalent to a total cost of **seven-hundred twenty thousand dollars**. 

Palm Sunday of the Passion of Our Lord—April 2, 2023

The Six Characteristics of an Everyday Stewardship for Lent – Accountable: Easter is only a week away, and churches everywhere in the West are beginning the holiest of weeks. For a moment, even the secular world will bow to religious observances: closings on Good Friday, Easter baskets filled with treats, and television specials featuring Biblical figures. You and I will be reflecting on the meaning of Lent and how we have died and risen with Our Lord, Jesus Christ, Either we have prepared well for this Holy Week observance, or we are left lamenting that maybe next year will be when we get back on track.

The question before us is: "To whom are we accountable?" Did our Lenten observance only have to do with us? Does it matter to anyone if we really took this time seriously or not?

Both faith and community are gifts from God. The Church exists so we may live out that faith and respond to God's call, being strengthened by the grace imparted through the sacraments and the community in which we find ourselves. If we are accountable to no one, then the community is simply an option on a Sunday morning, much like golf or household chores. If we are not accountable to God, then our faith is simply something we look to periodically when we are sad or frightened.

However, if we are accountable to each other and to Jesus Christ, then we must answer for our stewardship gifts of faith and community. The Body of Christ is counting on us. Without a strong sense of accountability, we think our actions only affect us. In the end, we are connected to each other through Christ in such a manner that no one ever stands alone. —Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS


Triduum: A Spiritual Pilgrimage

Section 2: Narrative - How MMG Parish organized the consultations:

Parish organization leaders as well as volunteers at large were sought out to be facilitators and note-takers during the consultations.

Manageable-sized small groups were made available and gathered; usually offered after Masses, and at the regular meetings of the various parish organizations. Individual consultations were also held as requested.

The facilitators and note-takers recorded and summarized the conversations held at these meetings.

In addition, consultation questionnaires were sent to all registered households in the parish. Returns were recorded and summarized.

All input was synthesized by the parish secretary and committee. This formed the basis of this report.

Section 3: Top Three Revealing Discoveries:

- 1) The people of the parish do feel a part of the Church, and they do their "journeying together" as they are present and participate in the Mass, the Sacraments. They also "journey together" as they become involved in the ministries, organizations, gatherings, and socials that are done as a parish family.
- 2) The people of God, our parishioners, have a very positive and warm experience of how the Church is journeying with them. They feel welcomed, acknowledged, and valued as individuals within the parish. They sense that leadership is trying to care about them, about their welfare and needs. They feel that fellow parishioners are one with them as a family-like group. Parishioners sense that they can reach out to other parishioners in their time of need.
- 3) The people of Mary Mother of God Parish are thirsting for better and more reaching out to those who seem no longer to come to church, as well as to welcoming those who are searching for a church and spiritual family. They would also like to strengthen their bonds with the Lord and with one another through additional spiritual and corporal works of prayer, service, and fellowship.



MAJOR CHANGES TO SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM!!!



In the Diocese of Little Rock, Beginning July 1, 2017:

WHO must do safe environment training and background checks:

- 1) Employees
- 2) Volunteers with Routine Contact w/ Minors
 - a. This includes only volunteers who have routine contact with minors as an essential part of their volunteer duties.
 - b. Volunteers who do <u>not</u> have routine contact with minors as an essential part of their duties do <u>not</u> have to do safe environment training or background checks.

WHAT training programs:

"CMG Connect" → online training for adults

(or directly at: https://littlerock.CMGconnect.org)

"Circle of Grace" → in-classroom training for children/youth

We will <u>no longer use VIRTUS's</u> "Protecting God's Children" or "Touching Safety." Instead, we will use products supported by **Catholic Mutual Group (CMG)**.

All data from VIRTUS will be moved over to CMG Connect. No one who has already done safe environment training and a background check will have to re-do anything at this time. Users who are due for a 5-year recertification will be notified how to do that by their parish/school safe environment coordinator, who will also have info on both new programs.
