WHAT IS CURSILLO?

Cursillo is a Spanish word that literally means "short course". The Cursillo Movement in the Catholic Church proposes not a new type of spirituality, but simply a method through which one's spirituality may be developed, lived, and shared in any area of human life.

Cursillo is a method to enable the baptized person to have the knowledge and conviction to live and share what is fundamental for being Christian, to love God and neighbor; this engenders an apostolic movement that tends to give it a Christian backbone. Those in Cursillo create groups of Christians who, while living what is fundamental in a conscious, ever-growing, and shared manner, instill Christian and spiritual criteria in the environments and structures into which Christian members are immersed.

The Cursillo movement has a two-fold purpose: to provide a foundation so the person may live what is fundamental for being Christian: love of God and love of neighbor through three encounters: encounter with oneself, with Christ, and with others, and secondly, to vertebrae (strengthen) Christianity in society through those who live what is fundamental for being Christian.

WE NEED YOU TO BE A CATECHIST! And we have training!

The <u>Faith Formation Office</u> recently created a new process for adults who teach the Catholic faith in Arkansas parishes and schools to become certified as a catechist. The 20-lesson, free online program offers video instruction presented by Arkansas clergy, religious and laity at <u>Learn.DOLR.org.</u> | <u>Enroll now</u>

When completed, the Diocese of Little Rock <u>Catechist</u> <u>Certification Course</u> provides basic certification for one

academic year to Catholic school teachers, directors of religious education, catechists, Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults coordinators and team members,

parish and school employees, Bible study leaders, campus ministers and youth leaders, or anyone else who serves in a teaching role.

The lessons can be completed at any pace or sequence and should take 12 to 15 hours to complete. Each 20-to-30-minute video

comes with questions to be discussed in a study group. Self-study does not count toward certification.

Being Catholic

I have friends in other religions that condemn gambling. What's the Catholic view?

Although Jesus speaks of our relationship with material wealth and the very human struggle with greed, the gospels do not include any specific instructions related to gambling. At the same time, the Church is very sensitive to the needs of those who might struggle with an addiction to gambling, and pastoral care should always be offered to those who struggle with this reality in their life.

While it is true that many parish or school communities include gambling or games of chance in festivals and fundraisers (e.g. bingo, roulette, ring tossing, dunking booths, etc.), there is nothing inherently wrong these sorts of events, given they are played fairly and within the limits of reason are not morally objectionable. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Games of chance (card games, etc.) or wagers are not in themselves contrary to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others" (no. 2413).

As in all things, moderation and a sense of healthy limits should be applied to gambling and games of chance. For those who find themselves living with addiction to gambling, help is available in various 12-step and addiction recovery programs. ©LPi
