Cut to the Heart

Everyone who has been married knows this feeling: you're in the midst of a disagreement with your spouse. You've really dug in your heels. You're ready to die on this hill. And you have the awful, heartbreaking realization that you are wrong. Whatever it is you're arguing about, you're wrong. You.

So where do you go from here? The only way forward is to own it. Fess up. Grab a fork and dig into that humble pie. It makes me cringe just to write about it, because it's the worst feeling.

I use the example of marriage because it's the one I'm most familiar with — my closest relationship, the one that teaches me the most about who I am and who God asks me to be. But this is a universal experience, and everyone — single or married, child or adult, lay or ordained — knows how badly it feels to realize that you're wrong. You're human. You messed up.

It is hard to recognize that the Christian life is one of ongoing repentance. It is painful to acknowledge the ways in which we are falling short, even as we strive to follow in Christ's example.

It can, in the words of today's reading, "cut to the heart."

But that feeling of despair is what propels forward motion. We have to allow ourselves to feel bad, that's the fertile ground of penitence. We are meant to have not just life, but life "more abundantly." Stasis isn't the goal. Baptism isn't the finish line.

Examining our conscience is hard. It cuts to the heart. It cuts to the truth.

WHAT IS CURSILLO?

Cursillo is a Spanish word that literally means "short course".

The Cursillo Movement in the Catholic Church proposes not a new type of spirituality, but simply a method through which one's spirituality may be developed, lived, and shared in any area of human life.

Cursillo is a method to enable the baptized person to have the knowledge and conviction to live and share what is fundamental for being Christian, to love God and neighbor; this engenders an apostolic movement that tends to give it a Christian backbone. Those in Cursillo create groups of Christians who, while living what is fundamental in a conscious, ever-growing, and shared manner, instill Christian and spiritual criteria in the environments and structures into which Christian members are immersed.

The Cursillo movement has a two-fold purpose: to provide a foundation so the person may live what is fundamental for being Christian: love of God and love of neighbor through three encounters: encounter with oneself, with Christ, and with others, and secondly, to vertebrae (strengthen) Christianity in society through those who live what is fundamental for being Christian.

DO YOU WANT TO BE A CATECHIST? WE HAVE TRAINING!

The [Faith Formation Office](#) recently created a new process for adults who teach the Catholic faith in Arkansas parishes and schools to become certified as a catechist. The 20-lesson, free online program offers video instruction presented by Arkansas clergy, religious and laity at [Learn.DOLR.org](#). | [Enroll now](#)

When completed, the Diocese of Little Rock [Catechist Certification Course](#) provides basic certification for one academic year to Catholic school teachers, directors of religious education, catechists, Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults coordinators and team members, parish and school employees, Bible study leaders, campus ministers and youth leaders or anyone else who serves in a teaching role.

The lessons can be completed at any pace or sequence and should take 12 to 15 hours to complete. Each 20-to-30-minute video comes with questions to be discussed in a study group. Self-study does not count toward certification.
