THE PRIESTHOOD AND THE EUCHARIST

"These two Sacraments were born together," wrote St. John Paul II of the priesthood and the Eucharist, "and their destiny is indissolubly linked until the end of the world."

The Eucharist is such a beautiful example of how God, conscious of our limitations, bends to meet us. He once came to us cloaked in the flesh, that we might recognize Him. Now He comes as the very means by which we nourish ourselves: food and drink, the most familiar and comforting thing in the world to us. How easy He makes it to fulfill his command that we become one with Him. How generous He is to make such a sacred thing also accessible.

We can say the same of the priesthood, and of the men He calls to its number. How generous of Him to make such an accessible thing — our sons, our brothers, our uncles, our cousins — sacred. How generous of Him to allow these human creations — who share in our own faults — to be the means through which He comes to us in the Eucharist.

Without the Eucharist, we would have no eternal life. Without priests, we would have no Eucharist. On this, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let's give thanks for our priests, and redouble our prayers that God will send us good and holy ones — manna from Heaven in our wandering exile.



COMPLETE FREE CATECHIST TRAINING BY JULY 31 and help our children grow in the Faith!

The Faith Formation Office recently created a new process for adults who teach the Catholic faith in Arkansas parishes and schools to become certified as a catechist. The 20-lesson, free online program offers video instruction presented by Arkansas clergy, religious and laity at Learn.DOLR.org. | Enroll now

The lessons can be completed at any pace or sequence and should take 12 to 15 hours to complete. Each 20-to-30-minute video comes with questions to be discussed in a study group. Self-study does not count toward certification.

SECOND COLLECTION NEXT SUNDAY

Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. We need your help to promote this collection with your parishioners. Guiding and strengthening young people's faith involves helping them fully live it through prayer, study, fellowship, and service. In Haiti's Diocese of Les Gonaïves, formation and outreach for youth leaders has taken this approach, combining seminars and workshops as well as activities that build community and help participants to serve the sick and imprisoned. This project, supported by funding from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Church in Latin America program, has brought together 400 youth leaders for formation sessions on the Bible, Church history, teachings from Vatican II and Pope Francis's encyclical Fratelli Tutti, meetings with parish delegates, outreach to hospital patients, a Christmas celebration for impoverished youth, and a visit to inmates of the Saint Marc prison.




