Our Annual Diocesan Mass for Life will be celebrated by Bishop Taylor next Sunday, January 22 at 12:05 PM at the Cathedral of Saint Andrew, 7th & Louisiana, Little Rock. Preceding the Mass, a Rosary for Life will be prayed beginning at 11:30 AM. The Vigil for Life at the Cathedral will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 6:30 PM on Saturday, Jan. 21, and will continue with Adoration throughout the night until 7 AM Sunday. Everyone is invited to participate in these celebrations of the precious gift of all life. *January 22 marks the anniversary of the 1973 US Supreme Court decision, which legalized abortion on demand. Since then, almost 60 million babies have lost their lives.* After the Mass for Life, the **39TH ANNUAL MARCH FOR LIFE** begins at 2 PM, behind the Capitol*. The Knights of Columbus will sponsor a complimentary chili/hotdog supper for all participants following the March at 6253 Camp Robinson Rd. in NLR.

NWA's Second Annual MARCH FOR LIFE - NWA Catholic Respect Life will sponsor the NWA's 2nd Annual March for Life next Sunday, January 22nd at 2:30 in Fayetteville. If you're not able to make the flight to Washington D.C., or the long drive to Little Rock, and want to make a public witness for the Sacredness of Life, then plan to meet in the parking lot at St. Joseph's Church (1722 N. Starr Drive in Fayetteville) at 2:30 PM. We will walk 2.9 miles to Planned Parenthood abortion center for a short rally and prayer in thanksgiving for the Sacredness of Human Life and an end to abortion. Following the gathering, we will meet back at St. Joseph for a social and hot cocoa.

**The March for Life will begin at Capitol Ave. and Wolfe St. in Little Rock. Staging is between Battery St. and Wolfe St. on West Capitol Ave. behind the Capitol. Reserved parking for Senior, Disabled or Families with Small Children will be available on Wolfe St. All others please park at open lots from Marshall to Summit or in front of the Capitol. No parking will be allowed behind the Capitol along the March for Life route. Please follow the sidewalk along 7th St. to reach the Staging Area. We will March rain or shine.*

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation is the process by which persons are prepared for full initiation into the Catholic Faith. If you have a spouse or friend who is not Catholic and would like to know more about the Catholic Church, contact Teresa at 577-7018.

The Diocesan Tribunal - It is the mission of the Diocesan Tribunal to hear the cases of those who are divorced and who are petitioning the Church to make judgment on the possible invalidity of their marriage, due to some impediment, inadequate consent or the inability to fulfill the duties of the married state. The Tribunal makes every effort to carry out its pastoral ministry in this process.

Petitions for decrees of nullity may be obtained from recognized Diocesan Tribunal advocates. These persons are specially trained in this work. Please contact our local advocates, **Deacon Mark Scouten at 741-1579, or Teresa Rotkowski at 577-7018,** for more information and the necessary paperwork in order to present a petition.

"If anyone is living in a marriage that has not been recognized by the Catholic Church, it would be wise to consult with a priest to see whether that situation might be rectified. It could be as simple as repeating your marriage vows quietly in front of a priest and receiving the Church's blessing.
