
None of the disciples dared to ask him.

at breakfast. If I don't have something substantial, I'm fading by midmorning. Breakfast is my key meal because it sets up my physical wellbeing for the rest of the day.

Spiritually speaking, we need sustenance to get us going. This is true for the Apostles in this Sunday's remarkable Gospel reading. The risen Jesus makes his third appearance to them in the early morning light and calls, "Come, have breakfast" (John 21:12). The exhausted and cold fishermen sit, and he feeds them bread and fish as the dawn breaks. They are overwhelmed by his presence to the point of awestruck silence. As they eat, their bodies and their hearts come alive. Once refreshed by their morning meal, they will be ready to feed others indeed, the whole world - with the love of the risen Jesus. But first, they need breakfast from him.

Do you realize how essential early morning prayer is? Jesus desires to refresh us every morning with his word of love, with his grace-filled presence. This week, hear Jesus calling to you: "Come, have breakfast!" Embrace some form of spiritual, meditative practice each morning for spiritual strength to get you going.



3rd Sunday of Easter



The Third Sunday of Easter, celebrated on May 4, 2025, centers around the Gospel passage where Jesus, appearing to Peter, asks him three times, "Do you love me?". This follows Peter's denial of Jesus on the night of his arrest and his subsequent feelings of shame and doubt. Jesus, in this passage, gives Peter a second chance to express his love and confirms his role as a shepherd of God's people.

Peter's Doubt and Shame:

After denying Jesus three times, Peter is likely feeling overwhelmed and unsure of his place in the community of disciples. He returns to his former life of fishing, seeking comfort in the familiar.

Jesus's Appearance and Question:

Jesus appears to Peter and the other disciples, who have been fishing, and they are reunited after the resurrection. Jesus then specifically addresses Peter, asking him three times if he loves him, mirroring the three denials.

Peter's Response and Jesus's Commissioning:

Peter affirms his love for Jesus each time, but Jesus emphasizes his commitment to tending and feeding God's sheep, giving Peter the opportunity to demonstrate his love through action.

The Shepherd Metaphor:

The three questions and the commands to "feed my lambs," "tend my sheep," and "feed my sheep" highlight the role of shepherd and the responsibility of caring for God's people, according to the Catholic Diocese of Wichita.

The Prophecy of Martyrdom:

Jesus also prophesizes that Peter will be crucified upside down, a foreshadowing of his eventual martyrdom, according to Fr Tony's Homilies.







A Safe Haven Baby Box is a temperature-regulated, secure box where a parent can anonymously and safely leave a newborn baby they are unable or unwilling to care for. The Truth About Abortion Abortion does not save women's lives. & Women's Health

Abortion is the direct and intentional

killing of a child in the womb.

Abortion is never medically necessary. It does not treat or solve any pregnancy-related complication.

Outlawing abortion will not affect treatment for miscarriage.

Treatment for miscarriage and abortion is not the same thing.

There is a complete moral and legal difference between losing a child through miscarriage and intentionally taking the life of a child.

In the tragic case of miscarriage, surgery may be necessary—and is an ethical treatment—to remove the remains of an unborn child who has already died.

While the same surgery is done to perform an abortion, abortions impose this procedure on a **living**, **child** with the **intention** of ending his or her life.

Women can get the lifesaving treatments they need-without abortion.

In rare cases, and in the absence of better alternatives, life-threatening maternal health conditions may require interventions that **indirectly** and **unintentionally** lead to the death of an unborn child. **Abortion restrictions will not prevent women from receiving these treatments.**

When the lives of mother and child are in immediate danger, the goal is to fight to save both patients. Effective treatments exist that seek to save the life of the mother and never to intentionally harm her unborn child.

When a woman's life is at risk in pregnancy, preterm delivery may be used as a lifesaving medical intervention to preserve the life of both mother and child.¹

Ectopic pregnancies

result when an embryo implants outside the uterus—often in the fallopian tube. Sadly, such embryos cannot survive and this condition can pose serious risks to the mother. While ectopic pregnancies sometimes resolve naturally, interventions are often necessary.

When done ethically, treatment for an ectopic pregnancy is not abortion. Ethical interventions include the removal of the damaged fallopian tube containing the embryo or, if embryo death has already occurred, medication can be used to resolve the ectopic pregnancy.

Bottom line: Abortion restrictions never prevent women from receiving life-saving treatment.²

In The Diocese of Little Rock



WHO must do safe environment training and background checks:

- 1) Employees
- 2) Volunteers with Routine Contact w/Minors
 - a. This includes only volunteers who have routine contact with minors as an essential part of their volunteer duties.
 - Volunteers who do not have routine contact with minors as an essential part of their duties do not have to do safe environment training or background checks
- 3) Eucharistic Ministers who serve the homebound
